Assessment Highlights (graduating class of 2023):

- BGU continues its membership with the Work College Consortium. 85% of BGU graduates believe that their experience was valuable in reducing their college costs.
- Our Alumni Survey results show that 35% of our three-year alumni have found employment in their field of study and 37% continued their studies with a higher degree.
- 80% of our most recent graduates believe they gained practical skills to use in like transitions (e.g., either going to or returning from the mission field.)
- The number one reason why our most recent graduates chose to attend BGU was Global Internship, and 80% of them believed it was the most effective element of the program that shaped and prepared them.
- Just over 83% of our most recent graduates believe that BGU prepared them to lead by serving whether cross-culturally or within their own context.
