Assessment Highlights (graduating class of 2025)

81% response rate (22 out of 27 potential responders)

Of our most recent graduates:

- 73% strongly agreed that they had many opportunities to grow in knowledge, skill and character throughout their program at BGU.
- The number one reason why they chose to attend BGU was Global Internship, and 82% of them believed it was the most effective element of the program that shaped and prepared them.
- Almost two-thirds believed that BGU prepared them to lead by serving whether cross-culturally or within their own context.
- Every single graduate agreed or strongly agreed that their education at BGU has been biblically grounded.
